## Beginning of the School Year Jitters

We understand the excitement and anxiety parents can have regarding their children and the start of a new school year, especially those in the primary grades. We strongly encourage parents to say goodbye at the bus stop, the school office, drop off location, or the kindergarten line in front of the building. Walking them to the classroom can make separation much more difficult for you and your child. Please remember that these transitions are often harder for parents then children. With that in mind, we understand that parents may want to walk their child to class the first few days of the new year and we welcome you to do so. We want to work with you to ensure a smooth start for you and your child.



## Sign In Procedures

These guidelines are an important part of ensuring a safe environment for your children. Parents entrust their precious children to us during the school year and we will do everything we can to keep our building safe. Please follow these guidelines to ensure all students are safe at Round.

- If you arrive after 8:50, please walk your child into the office and sign them in.
- If you pick your child up during the school day, please sign them out in the office. We will call them down for you.
- During school hours, all parents and visitors are required to sign in at the office in order to keep everyone safe.
- If you are dropping off items for your child during the school day, please bring them to the office. We will make sure they are delivered promptly. **It is important to minimize interruptions during classroom instruction.**

## **Sign Out Procedures**

Round Elementary is dedicated to a safe and secure environment for students, parents, and staff. The entrance is designed for the safety of our students. Students only exit from the gym and the main entrance at the end of the day. The following procedures will make pick up safe and secure.

- If you are picking your child up at the end of the day (3:50), you can wait for them at the entrance to the building. Please sign them out in the office. All students riding the bus will exit the main doors.
- Students being picked up will be dismissed to the gym at 3:40. Parents can sign their child out in the gym using the west parking lot at 3:45. Please call the office or send a note to let us know that your child is being picked up early. We appreciate when parents call before 3:00. Please be advised we are required to put them on the bus without a note.
- We encourage parents to avoid pick up between 3:30 and 3:40 due to the end of the day routines
  and procedures. Most teachers are teaching at this time, some students are preparing to go
  home in the hallway and some students may be returning from their afternoon recess. We
  understand that sometimes this is unavoidable and we are happy to have your child sent
  to the office for you.

## Breakfast and Lunch News

Round will **BE** offering breakfast this year. Free and reduced lunch applications can be found on the RES webpage and the HCS homepage. Copies are also available in the office.

If your child received free or reduced meals, they can continue this status for the first month of the school year while new applications are being processed. *A new application MUST be submitted at the beginning of each school year*. One application can be used for all of your children. Forms were emailed with your teacher announcement packet.

Please be aware that students are provided with a daily snack time. We encourage you to send healthy snacks to school such as yogurt, fruit, vegetables, crackers, raisins, cheese, etc.

## **READ ALL ABOUT IT!**


"A child who is on the way to independence needs to read often from many different books selected to be easy for him to 'go it alone.' It is the quantity of <u>successful</u> reading that builds the assured independence of the competent reader." Marie Clay

"Every child a reader" has been the goal of instruction, education research, and reform for at least three decades. We know that children who read the most at home surpass the educational success of their peers (who do not read at home) *-even those who are hard-working, capable students*.

Round Elementary is dedicated to increasing reading achievement and enjoyment at school and at home. To support our efforts and create a unified approach, all students will receive a take home reading bag. The colorful bags are water repellant, plastic and fabric with a carrying handle. Every child will be given a matching grade level colored bag to take home and return their "just right books" every day.

The importance of at-home reading for all students is well-documented. Children who read the most, both inside and outside of school, are the best readers, writers, spellers, possess the best vocabulary, and perform better in content-heavy areas like science and social studies.

We have book bags for each child from last year. Kindergarten students will receive the new book bags. The cost of the bag is \$5.00. Please consider donating \$5.00. If your child's book bag is lost or damaged during the school year we will provide them with a gently used bag.



## **Birthday Celebration Policy**

We love celebrating birthdays at Round! The staff at Round work hard to ensure every child feels special on their day and are celebrated during the day. **Please be aware that birthday decorations on/in lockers are not allowed**. Locker decorations are an unneccessary distraction. Many children get upset when other students touch or bump into their decorations. We appreciate your support as we work to make all birthdays special.



Due to the high number of life threatening allergies at our school it is necessary to eliminate food items from our birthday celebrations. Celebrating with non-food items will ensure that our school is safe for all students. Classrooms and the office will continue to ensure that birthdays are special days for students. We will continue to celebrate holidays as we have in the past. Your child's teacher will share details specific to their classroom. Thank you for your understanding as we work to make school safe for all students.

## Parking Lot Update!

As in years past, the drive in front of the building is reserved for busses. For the safety of our children, we now have an official "kiss and go lane" in the west parking lot. In addition to the signs directing you to the drop off area, maintenance has painted a designated lane and a safe area for students to walk. **Please remember that students need to exit your car on the passenger's side.** Please allow students to exit your car from the gym to the "stop" sign. This makes drop off efficient and safe!

We have two V.I.P. parking spaces reserved for our auction winners, thank you for your cooperation!

Finally, you may use the east parking lot to drop your child off in the morning (due to limited parking in the west lot), we ask that you park and walk your child into the building. The buses exit through the east parking lot so children need to be accompanied by an adult to ensure their safety.



## Important Attendance Policy Update!

As you may know, research has shown that physical attendance at school correlates to academic success. High absenteeism is linked to lower grade retention, reduced student achievement, and increased dropout rates. It is difficult to ensure that students who are not attending school regularly gain the social, emotional, and academic skills necessary to be successful. Hartland Schools is working hard to improve the attendance of our students in an effort to ensure their success now and in the future.

Hartland Consolidated Schools has a rich history of working collaboratively with parents and the community to ensure student success. We understand that children get sick and appreciate parental efforts to follow the HCS Elementary Parent-Student Handbook guidelines in regards to illness related absences. Absences accompanied by a doctor's note or a call on the absence line are considered when evaluating the number of absences. In an effort to work collaboratively with parents to increase student attendance, we have created a process that will prevent the negative effects of high absenteeism.

#### Steps in the Process:

- 1. When your child has been absent for 5 days you will receive a notification letter. This letter is intended to inform you that your child has missed 5 days.
- 2. When your child is absent for 10 days you will receive a notification letter. This letter is intended to inform you that they have been absent 10 days. 10 days is approximately 5% of the school year.
- 3. When your child has been absent for 15 days you will receive another letter and be contacted by the building principal to set up a meeting to create an attendance improvement plan/contract. Copies of the plan will be sent to our District Attendance Officer Mr. Mike Capra so he can begin monitoring your child's attendance plan and help reduce the likelihood of additional absences.
- 4. If your child's attendance does not improve and he/she reaches 20 absences, Mr. Capra will send a letter and a LESA Truancy Referral form to the LESA Attendance Officer for consideration of further action. 20 absences is more than 10% of the school year.

## **Round School Tardy Information**

Arriving to school on time and staying the full day are very important to your child's education!

Students will be considered tardy between 9:00 – 9:20 am. Students will be marked absent after 9:20 am.

Students being picked up between 3:20 and 3:45 pm will be marked as an early dismissal. If your child is picked up in the afternoon before 3:20 they will be marked absent in the afternoon.
